Dr. Pat Stanford, National Junior Chairman, recently passed away (October). She was a remarkable person, loved by all who knew her. She will really be missed.

### Old Business:

Art Young reported on the 37<sup>th</sup> General Congress held September 11-13, 2005 in Plymouth, MA. Albany colony was well represented at this triennial meeting. Terms of officers are for 3 years. Bette Bradway has just completed her 3-year term as Historian General and Art has been Captain General.

There were many controversial issues addressed regarding the bylaws and some needed updating. As a result, the bylaws continue to be worked on. The Assistant Governor General, Don West, who would normally move up, withdrew from the running for Governor General. Edward Sullivan, Counselor General, was elected by the membership. The Board of Directors consists of 120 members.

The next Congress in Plymouth will be in 2008.

There are 30,000 members in 50 states and Canada.

Plimoth Plantation Roll Players – The school program presented by this group has been cancelled for the forthcoming year as no one volunteered to do the coordination of this activity locally. It can be resumed when there is someone willing to take on this activity.

### Program:

Our guest speaker, Mr. Harry Taylor, shared many stories of local history created by the Dutch settlers in the Albany area. Mr. Taylor is a member of the Dutch Settlers Society, as well as the Capital District Genealogical Society and the Saratoga Battle Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution.

The Dutch contributed a great deal to our culture: food – cole slaw; sports – bowling and golf; customs – Santa Claus. They were a more sociable group than the New Englanders.

Henry Hudson was a courageous explorer hired by the Dutch East India Company to find a passage to Asia. Although he was unsuccessful, Hudson did sail up the river, named after him, to Fort Nassau. This became a Dutch settlement in 1614 called New Netherlands, and later renamed Albany.

In 1924 the Dutch Settlers Society was formed to foster and preserve memories of the Dutch settlement of Albany. Anyone descended from an Albany Dutch sdettler here before 1665 is eligible to join the Society.

The Lt. Governor is the leader of the colony, much like the President of an organization. Likewise, the 1st and 2nd Deputy Lt. Governors, are much like Vice Presidents, and may or may not have specific duties. Of course, the Treasurer maintains the Colony's funds and keeps the books, taking in and paying out of the treasury. The Captain maintains the Colony Flag, makes meeting arrangements, represents and leads the Parades, etc. carrying the Flag. Secretary, of course takes and presents the minutes of the previous meeting, usually in the Chronicles. 
