#### Richard Warren written by a descende

Written by a descendent of Richard Warren Lynn Keyes from Valley Falls, NY

Suddenly the plans changed. The Warren family was to travel together to the New World, but there was a problem with the ship. "What do you mean we can't come?" Elizabeth may have asked. "Leave them alone?" might have been Richard's astonished remark. Can you imagine leaving your wife and five children alone while you embarked on a journey of unspeakable peril, albeit excitement? What must those conversations between loving husband and wife, conversations which would shape a new land, have been like? Was he frightened? Was she angry? Were they excited? Elizabeth and Richard Warren were the participants in a discussion that ultimately helped found this country we now call home. I am proud to say the Warrens, my grandparents many times removed, had the courage to make the choice that Richard would continue on the adventure.

Am I romantizicing? Maybe. In his writings in Of Plymouth Plantation 1620-1647, William Bradford speaks of the possibility that Elizabeth and the children were initially to have made the trip with Richard, but when the much smaller Mayflower was substituted for the Speedwell, they were left behind. He says, "But others, in regard of their own weakness and charge of many young children were thought least useful and most unfit to bear the brunt of this hard adventure; unto which work of God, and judgment of their brethren, they were contented to submit." So it's possible and even probable that the group made the decision for the Warrens; Elizabeth and the children were to go back to London, Richard would go on alone. Join me in the romance as we think of that last kiss, the tender embraces between father and children, waves from the deck of the departing ship, tears unshed while figures grew smaller as the distance between grew longer. As we know, Elizabeth and children Mary, Anna, Sarah, Elizabeth and Abigail joined Richard three years later in the New World, where the births of Nathanial and Joseph completed the family. I am descended from Nathanial and his wife, Sarah.

I believe Richard was a Renissance Man; ahead of his time, viewing Elizabeth as a strong, capable partner. Years before, he had trusted her to raise his children if the unthinkable happened and he never saw them again, and he trusted her again to control his property after his death, in 1628. In a move highly unusual for the day, Elizabeth took over the management of his land. I wonder if Richard recognised Elizabeths talents and gave her the confidence to use them. Or maybe she believed in her own abilities and didn't need anybody's permission! In 1652, however, Elizabeth was having conversations very unlike those loving words she shared with her husband some decades prior. These were terse conversations with her son Nathanial; full of demands, refusals and acrimony. Nathaniel wanted all the land his Mother had deeded to family members returned to him, it's rightful owner, as his Father's heir. Apparently, Elizabeth's answer was a resounding NO, so Nathanial sued her to get the land! One of the first lawsuits in the Colonies! Not only did Elizabeth win the suit and keep all her land, but Peggy M. Baker wites in A Woman of Valor: Elizabeth Warren of Plymouth Colony that the arbitration panel told Nathaniel to forever cease all or other claims.... Elizabeth had won!

The character traits the Warrens passed on still live in my family, as I imagine they do in yours. We're brave people, ready for a challenge, up for a fight if we think we're right, with a bit of the self serving scalawag thrown into keep us humble. Thank you, Richard and Elizabeth. We're still here!
