Fundraising Chair Scott Miller (Orange County Colony) circulated samples of the California 400th Anniversary Challenge Coins and the ways that individuals and colonies can work together to raise needed funds for the 2020 Celebration. Celebration Ball Chair Sue Butler (Orange

County Colony) shared about the plans for a celebration ball to be held in May 2020.

Later in March, the 2020 Committee Chair Robert Dempster (Rancho Conejo Colony and GSMD 2020 Committee member), Carole Curran and California Governor Marcia Maloney met with the two largest float building companies. Fiesta Parade Floats and Phoenix Decorating Company supply most of the professionally built floats for the Rose Parade.

Just like our ancestors who planned and prepared for their voyage of hope, 400 years later we are planning and preparing for our voyage of hope. This project is being spearheaded by California, but it is important to remember that when this ship sails, it will sail as the General Society of Mayflower Descendants float with the Governor General at the helm.
